While your drama team has been reading "A Christmas Carol", all of you have been filling out character maps regarding certain stages of Scrooge's life. Now, your group will take this information and create a character poster.

What you can use:

- markers
- · magazine pieces
- construction paper
- images/words/drawings/pictures
 *The final product should not be in pencil!

What it should have on it:

- 1. four stages of Scrooge's life:
 - a. schoolboy
 - b. young Scrooge
 - c. Scrooge in the beginning of Act I
 - d. Scrooge by the end of the play
- 2. Details that reveal his character in each stage of life
 - a. What he says
 - b. What he does
 - c. What other characters do /say
 - d. Adjectives/character traits that describe him


